## **Description**

- The number of transit trips as a percent of the number of person trips, based on annual screen-line counts
- Screen-line: locations where trip counts are conducted
- Person trips: one-way trips made by individuals; includes trips by all modes of transportation
- Transit trips: one-way trips made by individuals on transit

Person with lead responsibility for this metric: Director, Public Engagement, Campus & Community Planning Data collection will be from: Transportation Planning Office

Date: Annually in the Fall using 5 locations (Vancouver); Every two years (Okanagan)

## **Explanation of Results**

75,600 (55%) of weekday person trips were public transit trips this year at the Vancouver campus. 4,720 (28%) of weekday person trips were public transit trips last year at the Okanagan Campus. Note: counts are done every other year only at the Okanagan.
