Description

Student Headcount (# of students)

- Headcount of students registered in the winter session as of 1 November
- Vancouver headcount includes Great Northern Way
- Undergraduate headcount includes baccalaureate and post-baccalaureate students

Annualized FTE (Full time equivalent based on course load)

- FTE of all students registered each term as of the official counting dates 1 August, 1 Nov, 1 March
- 1 undergraduate FTE = total credits divided by normal full time course load for each student
- 1 graduate FTE = 1 full time student or 3 part time students, measured each term and averaged for the fiscal year
- Undergraduate includes baccalaureate and post-baccalaureate students
- Includes domestic and international students

Undergraduate Course FTEs

- 30 credit FTEs (total credits divided by 30) for undergraduate level courses
- Domestic includes all students paying BC tuition rates
- International includes all students paying International Student (ISI) tuition rates
