

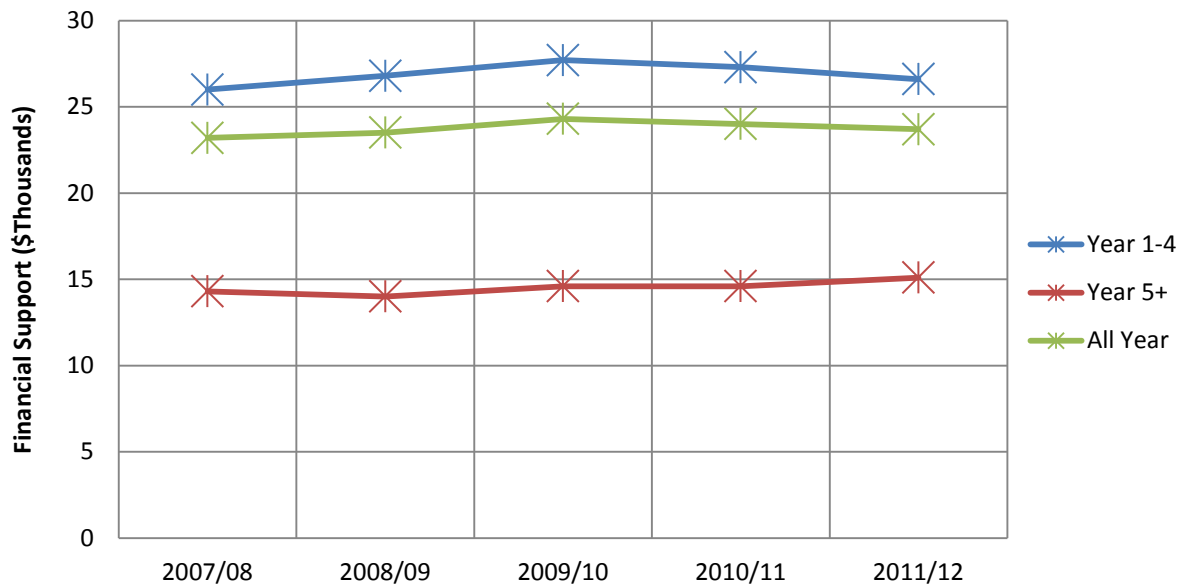

**Benchmark**

For benchmarking purposes, averages, by university and at the PhD level, can only be distributed up to the level of Board of Governors. Public (external reports/data presentations) need to have approval from the Chair, Executive Director and Coordinator of the U15DE.

Inclusion of the U15 reports in extended internal distribution (ie: Senate, Board of Governors) is permitted. For the data to be made public, there is a need to seek approval from each U15 member. To use the data to create "in-house" analysis,



approval from each U15 member is needed. Request for yearly approval would have to be done, or else forward approval for the concept of yearly metric updates would have to be established.

### Description

- Data is extracted from the Graduate Financial Support Study (Sep 2011 - Aug 2012) completed by the Faculty of Graduate Studies.
- PhD students (Year 1 - 4) in 2011/2012 were enrolled in 8 Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) divisions. These divisions include Social Sciences (287), Sciences (695), Professional Non-Health (64), Humanities (181), Health Sciences (456), Engineering (375), Education (178), and Business Management (45).
- Source of financial support to PhD students include research assistantship, teaching assistantship, bursaries/grants, internal awards (e.g. fellowship/scholarship), external awards (e.g. fellowship/scholarship from federal/provincial granting council), and other employment income.

**Data collection will be from:** Dean, Faculty of Graduate Studies/Manager-Data Systems and Analysis, Faculty of Graduate Studies

**Date:** Data collected for each academic year September 1-August 31. Data normally available in November of every year.
