Aboriginal Access Studies program receives 18 FTEs from the Ministry of Advanced Education. The number of students who have started in Aboriginal Access studies and have transitioned into a degree program.

Explanation of Results

Aboriginal Access Studies enrolment and number of students transitioning to their degree programs continues to be steady. The number of students who will transition to their degree programs will not be able to be reported until the end of August.

Recommended Action

1. Continue to work with En'owkin Centre on Aboriginal Access Studies student enrolment
2. Continue to work with Enrolment Services on identifying and providing Aboriginal students with offer to Aboriginal Access Studies instead of refusal letter
3. Continue to work with school district Aboriginal education departments about Aboriginal Access Studies
4. Further develop relations with Aboriginal organizations that work with mature students
